Stroller Sleeping Bag

Keep baby cozy and warm in this fleece-lined sleeping bag, with seatbelt holes to keep him safe and snug! The measurements to follow should fit a baby up to about 1 year in age, for a toddler add an extra 20.5cm (8in) to the length.

Finished size
104 x 109 cm (41" x 43")

What you need

- One piece of outer fabric measuring 104 x 20.5 cm (41" x 8")
- One piece of lining fabric measuring 104 x 20.5 cm (41" x 8")
- One piece of webbing/elastic measuring 112 x 20.5 cm (44" x 8")
- 10 x buttons (50 x 20) and sewing fabric or paper and matching thread to make a template
- Machine (2000) and/or
- Hand-stitched sewing machine

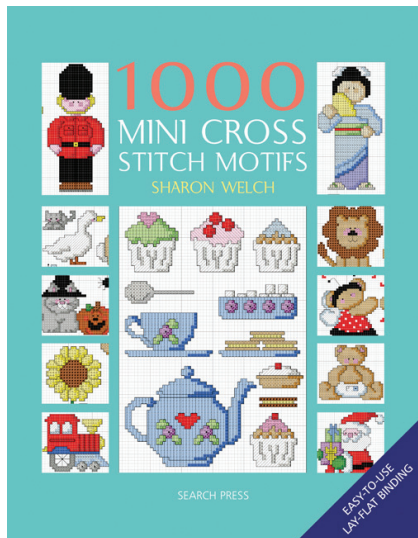
1 Push your snug piece of fabric or paper into the back of the stroller and mark the position of the seatbelt straps.

2 Measure your piece of fabric or webbing.
At the center fold, cut down 10.5 cm (4 1/8") from the top, leave rest on the right hand side through the top layer of fabric only. You will now have a large "C" shape of fabric, paper for the lining fabric.

Fabrics

Cross stitch is described as a counted-thread technique, because it is normally worked on an evenweave fabric or Aida.

In every 2.5cm (1in) of evenweave fabric, there are the same number of warp and weft threads. This offers a grid structure across and down, making it an ideal fabric for cross stitch. It is available in a variety of colours, in 22, 25, 27, 28 and 32 count grades. Stitching is normally worked over two threads, unlike Aida which is worked over one. The number of threads vary depending on the thread weights and the number is referred to as the count.

Aida is the same with different counts, but it is more solid, offering a good base for beginners, or for those seeking to improve their skills. For the motifs in this book use a 14-count fabric, which is perfect for the mini designs.

Soluble Aida dissolves in warm water, which makes it ideal if you want to add motifs to smooth fabrics or those with an uneven weave.

Vinyl Aida is a versatile man-made type of plastic which can be shaped, folded and cut. It does not fray, is water resistant, and it is ideal for bookmarks, placemats, napkin rings, Christmas decorations, photograph frames and gift tags.

Magic Aida has a printed ten-stitch grid, which makes counting much easier when working. The grid, when immersed in water at a temperature of forty degrees centigrade, will magically disappear.

Plastic canvas is also available in several counts and colours. This can be stitched, then cut to create three-dimensional items.

Aida bands are available in several colours, and in a variety of widths and different counts. They can be used as borders on soft furnishings and for small projects.

Frames

Frames or hoops prevent the stitching from being pulled out of shape and they are available in various sizes. While stitching, the fabric can be moved around easily in a hoop to enable you to work on new areas, whereas with a frame this is not possible because the fabric is securely attached to the surrounding wooden bars.

A rectangular frame and hoops.

The Motifs

These mix-and-match motifs are grouped into popular subjects, from the cute and lovable animals opposite right through to the zodiac series. The thread colours and related symbols on the charts are shown on page 254, and a helpful index on the final pages of the book lists all the characters in this fun collection.

GARTER STITCH SCARF

A simple garter stitch scarf is a classic knitting project. It is an ideal practice piece because garter stitch is easily made up of knit stitches, so it is very easy to make. The scarf doesn't really have to match the exact measurements, so any tension variations won't be that noticeable. Garter stitch creates a very dense and warm fabric that is perfect for a winter accessory. A long garter stitch scarf is a great 'test' knitting project – just be sure to choose a yarn that you will really enjoy knitting with.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Techniques used

Project dimensions
Finished width: 33cm (13in)
Finished length: 187cm (73in)

Tension
9 sts measure 10cm (4in). Row tension is not crucial for this project.

Yarn
4 balls of super chunky;
60% wool/20% alpaca;
100g (3.5oz), 90m (98yd)
in dusty pink.

Equipment
8mm (US size 13) needles
Tapestry needle

STOCKING STITCH

PATTERN

- 1 Using the long tail cast-on method, cast on 47 sts.
- Row 1 (RS): Knit
- Row 2 (WS): Purl
- Repeat Rows 1–2 until the piece measures 97cm (38 in) long.
- Cast off knitted.

Finishing

- 1 Block the piece.
- 2 Fold the piece in half the following way:
Wrong sides (purl sides) are together.
Cast-on and cast-off edges should be touching.
- 3 With right side facing, sew the right and left side edges together with mattress stitch.
- 4 Using a cushion insert that is 1.3–2.5cm (1/2–1in) larger than the cover, insert it into the opening on the knitted piece.
- 5 With right side facing, sew the cast-on and cast-off edges together with an invisible horizontal seam. Weave in the ends.

Invisible Horizontal Seam

A horizontal seam is ideal for joining two cast-off edges or one cast-on edge and one cast-off edge. This technique creates a neat and invisible seam that is perfect for joining shoulder seams or the parts of bags, for example.

- 1 Lay the pieces flat, with the right sides facing out, and the cast-off/cast-on edges facing each other. Line up the pieces stitch by stitch. (To create a neat seam, it is important to have the same number of stitches on each piece.)
- 2 Thread a tapestry needle with the same yarn you used for knitting the piece and insert the needle under a stitch inside the cast-off/cast-on edge on one side.
- 3 Insert the needle under a corresponding stitch inside the cast-off/cast-on edge on the other piece. Pull the yarn through.

Repeat Steps 2–3 until you have joined all the stitches.

TIP

To create a removable cover, sew buttons along one edge instead of seaming the cast-on and cast-off edges together.



LESSON | 3

1X1 RIB STITCH

1x1 rib stitch is one of the most popular types of ribbing. It is formed by alternating between one knit and one purl stitch. Because 1x1 rib is very elastic and stretchy, it is often used for finishing the hems of garments, sleeve cuffs and necklines, as well as for knitting accessories, such as hats, mitts and socks. When unstretched, 1x1 rib can look similar to columns of stocking stitch, with the purl stitches hidden between the knit columns; when stretched, the purl stitches will appear.

- 1 Using the long tail cast-on method, cast on 100 sts. Join for working in the round, placing a stitch marker onto the right needle to mark the end of the round.
- Row 1: *K1, p1, repeat from * to the marker.
- Row 2: *P1, K1, repeat from * to the marker.
- Row 3: *P1, K1, repeat from * to the marker.
- Row 4: *P1, K1, repeat from * to the marker.

- 2 Repeat Rows 1–4 another 20 times or until the piece measures the desired size.
- 3 Repeat Row 1.
- 4 Cast off knitted.

Finishing

- 1 Block the piece.
- 2 Weave in the ends.

BROKEN RIB STITCH



Broken rib stitch is a variation of 1x1 rib that is broken after every four rows, which creates knit stitch columns arranged in chequerboard order. As a result, both sides of the fabric produced are identical. Broken rib is elastic, wide and stretchy, and lies flat and doesn't roll up. The knit stitch columns offset after every four rows create depth and texture, resulting in a very dense and warm fabric. The stitch has an eight-row vertical repeat but is very easy to memorise, which makes broken rib an ideal stitch pattern for bag projects, such as throws, blankets, afghans and rugs.

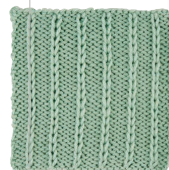

- Row 1 (RS): P3, *1 sl 1 w/pt, p3, repeat from * across to end.
- Row 2 (WS): K3, *p1, k3, repeat from * across to end.
- 2 Repeat Rows 1–2 until the piece measures approximately 12.5cm (5in).
- 3 Cast off knitted. Weave in the ends.



FRONT: The decorative effect of an elongated stitch stands out against the simple garter stitch background.



BACK: The wrong side of the fabric has a compressed effect due to the raised stitches on the right side.

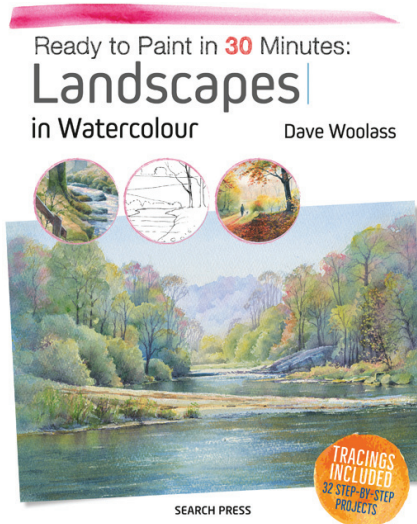


SLIP STITCH MITTS

Fingerless mitts are a great accessory to keep your hands and wrists warm when the temperature drops. The slip stitches are set against a reverse stocking stitch background to create a very elegant visual effect, with beautiful textured lines running vertically along your hand. Knitted in a cashmere/wool blend, this project is a joy to knit and wear.
