# Purple Mist Snood

## Materials:

>> 1 ball of light worsted (DK/8-ply) merino varn in variegated purple/ >> Circumference: 24in (61cm), height: 81/4in (21cm) lilac; 100g/251yd/230m

#### Needles:

>> 5.5mm (US 9, UK 5) knitting needles

### Size:

#### Tension:

>> 19 sts x 24 rows = 4in (10cm) square using 5.5mm (US 9, UK 5) knitting needles

## Instructions:

Cast on 41 sts, then ktbl to form a neat edge.

**Row 1:** k3, p2, \*k1, p1, k1, p4, repeat from \* to last 8 sts, k1, p1, k1, p2, k3.

Row 2: k3, k2, \*p1, k1, p1, k4, repeat from \* to last 8 sts, p1, k1, p1, k5. Row 3: k3, p2, \*kfbf, p1, kfbf, p4, rep from \* to last 8 sts, kfbf, p1, kfbf, p2. k3.

**Row 4:** k3, k2, \*p3tog, k1, p3tog, k4, rep from \* to last 12 sts. p3tog. k1, p3tog, k5.

Repeat rows 1–4 until work measures approximately 24in (61cm). Cast off, leaving a long varn tail for sewing up your work.

#### MAKING UP

Press snood lightly. With RS facing, join cast-on and cast-off ends using mattress stitch. Weave in all loose ends.



This is a very simple, textured snood that only uses one ball of a lovely variegated yarn.

## Parisienne Chic Scarf

### Materials:

>> 2 balls of lace weight (1–3-ply) yarn in light pink; 50g/437yd/400m

#### Needles:

>> 4mm (US 6, UK 8) knitting needles



## Instructions:

Cast on 56 sts, then ktbl to form a neat edge.

#### **SCARF PATTERN**

Rows 1-4: knit.

Row 5: \*k1, wyrn\*, repeat from \* to \* until last stitch, k1.

Row 6: \*k1, drop the stitch you wrapped in previous row\*, repeat from \* to \* until last stitch, k1.

Rep rows 1–6 until you have knitted 72% in (184cm), finishing with 4 rows of garter stitch.

Cast off.

#### **MAKING UP**

Weave in all loose ends.

This is a simple scarf that has been knitted in a very fine lace yarn. You can drape it in many ways and it is a great asset to a spring or summer wardrobe.

## **Button Boot Cuffs**



Row 1: knit into the back of sts to form a neat edge.

Row 2: \*k2, p2\* rep to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: \*p2, k2\* rep to last 2 sts, p2.

#### Row 4: as row 2.

**Row 5:** as row 3.

Rows 6–23: rep rows 2–5 four more times and then rows 2 and 3 once more.

Row 24: cast off 6 sts then \*k1, p1\* to end of row.

**Rows 25–39:** \*p1, k1\*, rep from \* to \* to end of row.

**Row 40**: cast off, leaving a long piece of yarn to sew up seams.

#### MAKING UP

With RS facing, use mattress stitch to join the side seams of the rib component of the boot cuff. Turn the boot cuff inside out and sew the cast-off flap onto the main body of the cuff with a neat hemming stitch. Sew up the flap on the reverse side. Weave in all loose ends. Using mid blue yarn, sew one button at the top edge of the flap and one at the bottom edge of the flap.
